DID YOU KNOW? BY ST. PAUL SCHOOL BOARD

Open positions are available on the School Board and the Home and School Committees. These committees typically meet once per month on open meeting night to discuss issues related to the school and to offer viable solutions.

- The St. Paul School Board is an educational advisory committee of the Parish Council consisting of permanent and elected positions. The permanent positions are held by the Parish Pastor, the school principal, a teacher, and a member of the Parish Council.

- There are nine elected positions on the school board that are held by dedicated people who serve the committee for up to two three-year terms. These terms are staggered such that three new positions become available annually as three expire.

- Any parish member aged 18 or older with a desire to serve is eligible for consideration.

- Our school is successful in large part due to the efforts of the hard working volunteers who fill these and other positions.

- Anyone is welcome to attend the Public Comments portion of the monthly meetings.

- Minutes of the school board meetings are posted on the parish website.

- Have you ever considered participating in parish or school leadership? Be active in your child's education! Come join us!

The major advantage that you have is going online to your account and purchasing SCRIPNOW and receiving your e-card within minutes. By using your online account, you can see exactly how much you are spending and receiving as credit. You also have access to reloads and e-cards for instant purchases.

Using **PrestoPay** and shopping online makes things easier for all involved especially if you want to continue to build on your TIP over the summer. When setting up PrestoPay you will be given a code to send to your coordinator. Please e-mail me the code and I will get it entered as quickly as I can; csscott238@gmail.com and email you back so you can order right away.

Please return forms by **May 31st, 2012**. All forms need to be returned **PRIOR TO** your child's first practice. Children are not allowed to practice without a current Physical Exam Form or Parent Permission form on file and registration fee paid. Registration forms received after the due date of May 31st, 2012 will only be accepted if there is room on the team.

Eligibility: All students who will be in grades 5th through 8th in the fall (2011), who attends St. Paul or are enrolled in the Religious Education Program at St. Paul Parish are eligible to participate in the St. Paul Athletic Program. Students must work up to their ability in the classroom and observe the behavior code at the school. Guidelines for scholastic effort and behavior are established and enforced by the school principal with the cooperation of the athletic director and coaches.

Parent Permission Form: Students participating in any sport offered through St. Paul are required to have a current (yearly requirement) Archdiocese Parent Permission Form (Form 6145.2(a)) on file at St. Paul. Please submit a completed form with this registration form. This form can be found on the St. Paul website under "Downloads". Students who do not have a current form on file will not be allowed to participate in the St. Paul Athletic Program.

Physical Exam Form: Students participating in any sport offered through St. Paul are required to have a current (every 2 years requirement) Archdiocese Physical Exam Form (Form 6145.2(b)) on file at St. Paul. Please submit a completed form with this registration form. This form can be found on the St. Paul website under "Downloads". Students who do not have a current form on file will not be allowed to participate in the St. Paul Athletic Program.

Participation Fee: There is a **\$60.00** fee per child, per school year. (This one time, yearly fee, will cover the student's participation for any and all sports that child chooses to participate in for the entire 2011-2012 school year). The registration fee is payable to "**St. Paul Church**" with "**Athletics**" noted in the memo. There will be a \$5.00 late fee per child, if not paid by the deadline.

Special Note: If there is any interest in playing, please turn in this form. Even if there doesn't seem to be enough players to create a full team. In past years, St Paul has worked with the Religious Ed program and other catholic schools in the area to gain additional players. If, after exploring these additional sources a team still can't be formed due to insufficient number of players, the St. Paul Athletic Association will refund the registration fee. Late registrations will only be accepted if there is room on the team.
